

A MESSAGE FROM RABBI GABI



I am still on a high from last week where our community welcomed our first ever Sephardi Sefer Torah. It was wonderful to see so many of you last week, as we danced the Torah into our community centre, knowing that this Torah will be the anchor to so many of our upcoming simchas and opportunities for celebration together as a community. It is also heartening to be able to call a Sefer Torah our very own. How wonderful and how exciting!

The Torah was donated in honour of the late Moshe Adut, an exceptional man who I knew when I was a child, and always immensely respected. Moshe was Sephardic, growing up in Izmir Turkey before making his way to Israel. I knew Moshe growing up because his wife, Gabby, is a close family friend, and their son Itamar became my dear friend when they came to live in Australia for a few years. Moshe was one of those people that said it how it was. Straight shooting. Fiercely clever. Very good with his hands. He loved Israel with all his might and passed away at an untimely age due to COVID.

When his wife, Gabby, came to visit my mother a few years ago, she was flipping through the ARK Times magazine, and she was astounded to read about our community centre, and the great work we do both inward and outward. Gabby decided that the Torah should go to ARK Centre based on the universalist (modern orthodox) approach we have to Yiddishkeit. No matter what your heritage is, ARK Centre is renowned for embracing you, and accommodate everyone as best we can. I also look forward to showing this Torah to the school children that often come through our doors to learn about Judaism. Being able to show them Moshe's Torah, alongside the other Ashkenazi ones will be an experience that they won't be able to get at many other synagogues. This gift is something that we will cherish for years to come, and we thank the Adut family for their generosity, their commitment to Torah, and for spreading Torah by allowing our shule to have this privilege of hosting a Torah written in Moshe's honour.

Like Moshe's ancestry, this Torah is written in Sephardic tradition. Its case is upright, and it is read differently from the Ashkenazi Torah that are placed down on the reading desk on the Bimah (stage). I feel that this symbolises the unity of the Jewish people currently. No matter where we are from in the world, whether we are Ashkenazic or Sephardic, we are united behind our love and hope for Israel and its people.

It's testament to the excitement in our community that so many of you came to dance and celebrate together last Friday. Such a wonderful opportunity to be present and see the wonder that comes from having a community that knows when to show up and care for each other, in the good times and the challenging.

I hope that in the merit of this Torah, donated in honour of a dear friend, the late Moshe Adut, we emulate many of his characteristics. A commitment to Torah and Mitzvot. A commitment to Judaism and tradition. A powerful sense of justice and helping those that are in need or feeling down. But most of all, a fierce love of humanity, the land of Israel and the traditions that we are lucky to be part of.

ALLIANCE AGAINST ANTISEMITISM in HEALTH CARE AAAHC - SURVEY

ALLIANCE AGAINST ANTISEMITISM in HEALTH CARE

We're a group of doctors who are concerned about the rise in antisemitism in the healthcare system. We created AAAHC – the Alliance Against Antisemitism in Health Care, in order to address this. We have done a pilot survey of over 150 health professionals and discovered that around a third have experienced antisemitism in the workplace, more than half are feeling as though they need to hide their Jewish identity in the workplace. A significant proportion of those who have experienced antisemitism feel unable to escalate it.

We are asking for your help in reaching a wider range of those working in the healthcare sector, particularly nursing and other allied health staff. We want to collate the results to be able to lobby politicians to effect real change in our hospital systems.


