A MESSAGE FROM RABBI GABI



This week's Parsha, Mishpatim, marks a shift in the story of the Jewish people. In the weeks leading up to Mishpatim, the Book of Shemot retells the story of the exodus from Egypt. Each week we build up in anticipation, as we hear about the rise of the new Pharaoh, who didn't remember Yoseph and the Jewish people who had helped the Egyptians survive the global famine, and become the centre of the world's commerce.

We read about the enslavement of the Jewish people from the lowest depths of slavery, and each week we read the increasing despair of the Jewish people. We hear of Moshe's genesis being raised in the home of the Pharaoh, to being an exile living in Midyan. And finally we read about the plagues, the miraculous Exodus from Egypt finishing with the Jewish people becoming a nation, and receiving the Torah at Har Sinai.

And then, all of a sudden, after weeks of anticipation and becoming a nation, the Torah suddenly shifts, and Parshat Mishpatim arrives with details of many laws that the Jewish people are required to adhere to, without much narrative given.

Why does the Torah do this? Of course, there's the famous expression that there is no beginning or end to the Torah, and we don't expect it to go in order, but at the same time, nothing in the Torah is random. So there is significance in each part of how the Torah is compiled, including which sections follow each other.

The way I like to think about it is that the Jewish people are required to live their values. While knowing our origin story is crucially important, the practice of how we behave as a moral community is also important. It's like digging up a fossil, sure, you can tell a lot about society, its history, probably with recent scientific advances you may be even able to tell what the person from thousands of years ago ate and what their health was like.

But answering basic questions about what they did, how they behaved, and what kind of person they were is impossible. That information is not recorded anywhere. Yet with Jewish people the exact opposite is true.

We have existed as a people for thousands of years. Judaism is the foundation from which so many values are incorporated into the world's legal systems. And we can point exactly to what kinds of people our ancestors were, and what their behaviour was like. The Torah in this week's Parsha outlines Jewish values. The way Jewish people are required to live in order to conduct a moral life, how we are

to interact with each other, and precise outlines of what G-d expects from each and every one of us.

This beautiful message is an enduring one. We are the people of the Book, because our book contains our origin story, but also our values and ethics code which into the 21<sup>st</sup>century not only endures but evermore retains its relevance!


# JEAP APP CSG & Hatzolah App
